



Climate Alliance strategy on CO2 pricing

28 September 2022, 16:00 to 18:00 h.

OBJECTIVE

If greenhouse gas emissions do not come at a price, we will continue to treat those emissions economically as if they were non-existent. The solution to this problem is a price on CO2 emissions connected to the market. Carbon pricing is an important part of the strategy towards a low carbon economy. Together with its Dutch member Klimaatverbond Nederlands, Climate Alliance now tackles this issue by developing a realistic Carbon pricing model for European municipalities.

The Climate Alliance is currently preparing together with Klimaatverbond a project proposal in order to develop a CO2 model applicable to any European municipality, involving a selected group of municipalities from France, Belgium, Ireland, Germany and the Netherlands. Taking into account that the participation in this project is limited to a small group of municipalities only, the Climate Alliance would like to disseminate and extend this topic to a wider group of municipalities, through the Working Group CO-Pricing, in order to discuss and work on the dissemination and implementation of this topic among the municipalities of the Climate Alliance.

Goal of this first meeting is to explain the actual development of the topic CO2-Pricing, the Climate Alliance strategy on the topics, so as possible future steps.
